TOP CLUB

As Top Club Chairperson for the second year, I would like to clarify how points are awarded. Top Club Contest rules are located in your 2008-2009 District Directory. Each District Governor makes minor changes to the Top Club contest, so it is important that secretaries carefully review the contest rules. Every attempt is made to consistently award points to clubs based upon the rules. How is this done? By the end of each month, club secretaries send their activity reports to the Top Club Chairperson to interpret these reports and **consistently** award points. As a courtesy, I always respond to the club secretary via email so that they know that I have received and read their reports each month. In addition, if I need any clarification regarding their report, I contact the secretary directly.

For example, a club may state that they hosted a program at a regular meeting. If the program is a District 4-A1, Multiple District-4 and/or International Endorsed Activity Program, points are awarded. Clubs may report sponsoring a project. Again, the project must be a District 4-A1, MD 4 and/or LCI Endorsed Activity project to receive points.

As Top Club Chairperson last year and again, this year, I have had the opportunity to review many different ways that secretaries report their club activities. Please be assured that I interpret all secretaries' reports and consistently award points according to our published rules. During secretary training, PDG Don Allen and I have emphasized and encouraged ALL clubs to report activities **without** points. I have distributed samples of reports that I have received. It should not be assumed that everything that is reported earns points. It is the Top club Chairperson's responsibility to award points according to the contest rules.

To date, I have received April, May and June reports from the following clubs:

Division A – Delta, Garrotte, Greater Modesto, Mariposa Golden Oak, San Andreas 49ers, Stockton San Joaquin, Tracy Tank Town, and West Point.

Division B – Atwater Winton, Clements Lockeford, Dos Palos, Lake Don Pedro Gold Chain, Madera Evening, Merced Breakfast, Modesto, Mokelumne Hill, Ripon and Sonora.

Division C – Arnold, Escalon, Jackson, Madera Breakfast, Modesto 500, Oakdale, Tracy Breakfast, and Turlock.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is in response to a club's concerns that after reviewing other club M & A's that certain clubs are not playing by the "rules". 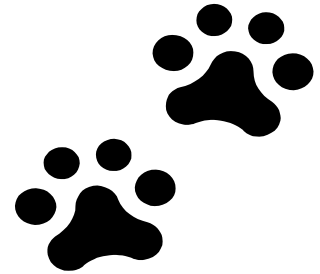

Two new hands-on club programs have been introduced to fulfill the association's commitment to the environment and encourage beautification of the community:

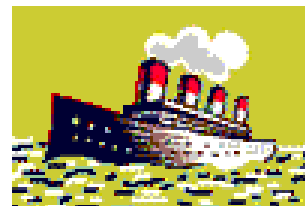
1. **Lions Green Team** – Organize a high-visibility environmental project, such as a community clean-up, tree planting or recycling effort.

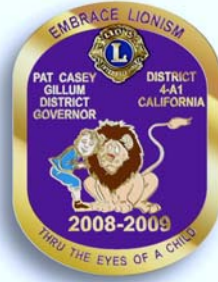
